Civil Litigation

County

- Can be named to any suit
- Can be named erroneously
- Privacy and Security Incidents
- Automobile Accidents

Judges and Commissioners

- Employment matters
- Takings/Property
- Slip and falls
- Elections disputes
- Public policy disputes



Civil Litigation

Sheriff

- Jail matters including deaths
- Excessive use of force

Clerks/County and District Attorneys

- Professional negligence
- Acts or omissions
- Malicious prosecution



- Carrier determines coverage
- Have a plan if not covered
