




WISE ABOUT

to all persons to whom these presents
may come greeting.

Know ye that I, reposing special confidence
in the ability, integrity & legal learning
of Benjamin Franklin: I do hereby by
and with the consent of the cabinet of Texas
appoint him Judge in & for the judicial
district of Nogos. And by these presents do
not him at such with all power jurisdiction
and emoluments by law pertaining to said
office by him to have & to hold said
office until the end of the next session
of Congress & so longer.

Given under my hand this eighth
day of May A.D. One thousand eight hundred
& thirty six, and of the Republic the first
at our place at Galveston.

District of Brazos

To the Honourable B & C Franklin Judge of the
District of Brazos. I represent to you, that on the
second day of June last in the Bay of Brazos - off
the port of Copano Major I W Burton of the List
as Army - seized and brought into port in this
district immediately thereafter the ~~Socorro~~
Schooner Watchman having on board a cargo
containing provisions &c &c. the property of the enemies
of Texas - to wit the Mexican Government - and de-
tined for the Mexican army - that the said
cargo was contraband of war - that the Master
of said Schooner Capt. J. M. May has exhibited no
manifest bill of lading or any other memorandum
showing the contents of said cargo - that the
said Schooner being engaged in the transportation
contrary to the law of nations and a deposit of any
of contraband of war, has for further her neutral-
ity - and ought to be condemned as also her car-
go for the benefit of the government of Texas and
her captors - wherefore I pray that the foregoing
facts be enquired into - and that by the
Judgement of your Honourable court - the
said Schooner and cargo may be condemned
and named to be sold or otherwise disposed
of according to law as may seem best for
the benefit of the Government of Texas
and the captors - and as in duty bound
