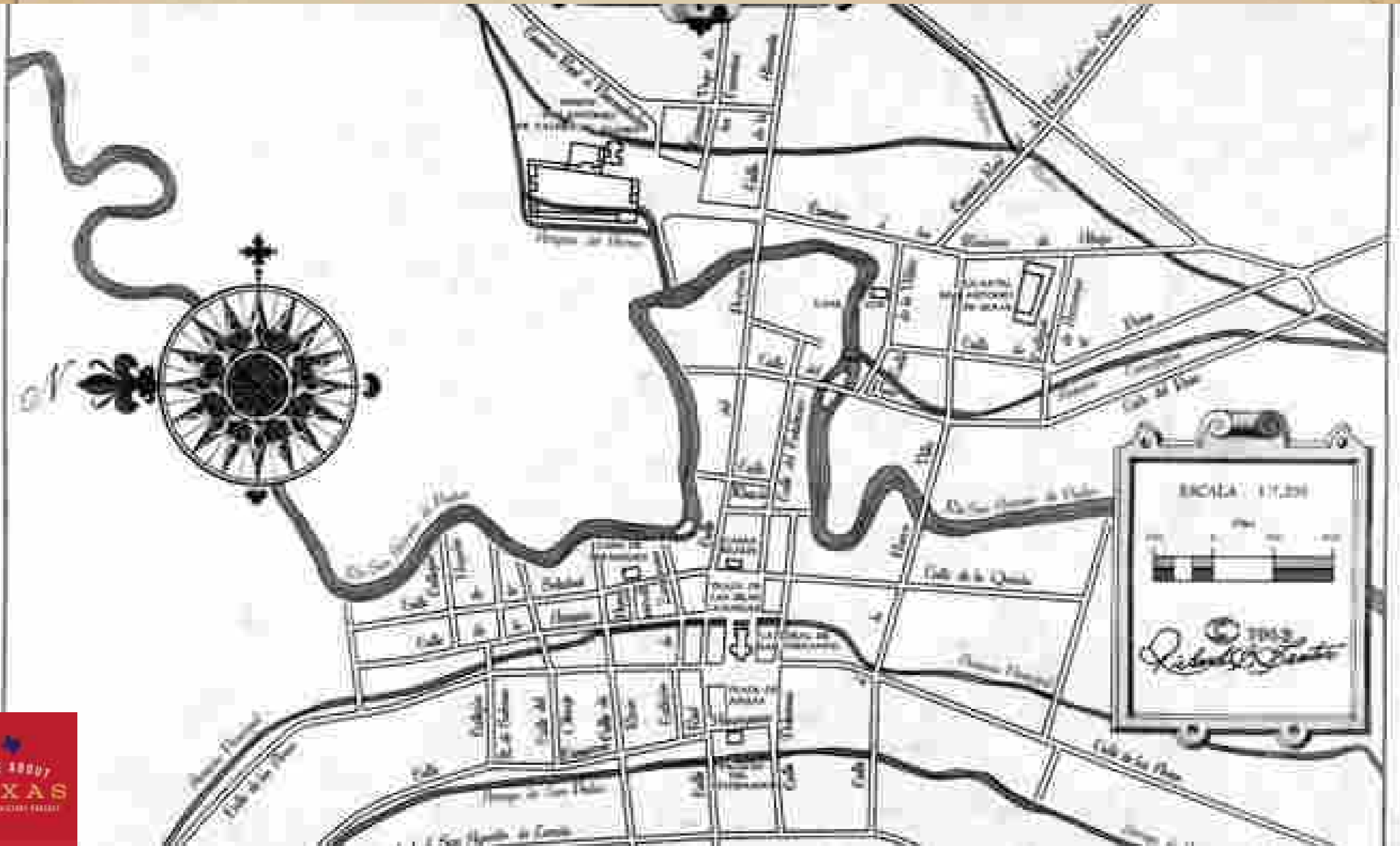




HARRIS COUNTY 1836 COURTHOUSE

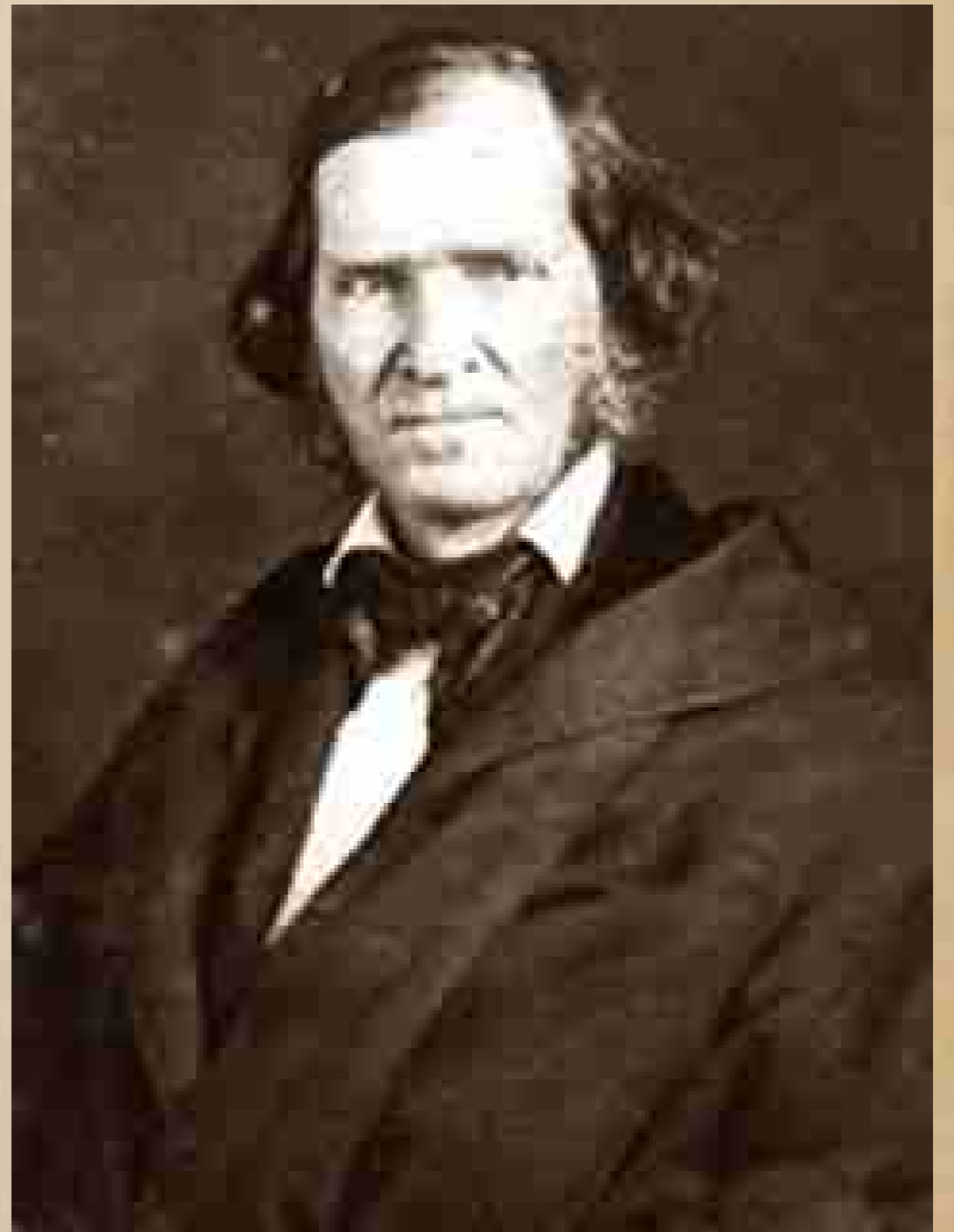

Know ye that reposing special confidence
in the ability, integrity & legal learning
of Benjamin C. Franklin: & do hereby, by
virtue of the consent of the cabinet of U.S.A.,
appoint him Judge in & for the judicial
district of Oregon. And by these presents do
vest him as such with all power jurisdiction
and emoluments by law pertaining to said
office by law. To have & to hold said
office until the end of the next Session
of Congress & no longer.

Given under ~~my~~ hands this eighth
day of May A.D. One thousand eight hundred
& thirty six and of the Republic the first
at our place at Washington.

Republic of Texas
District of Brazos

To the Honourable B. C. Franklin Judge of the
District of Brazos. I represent to you, that on the
second day of June last in the Bay of Brazos - of
the part of Coahuila Major I. W. Buxton of the 1st
as Army seized and brought into port in this
District immediately thereafter the ~~schonner~~
Schonner watchman having on board a cargo
containing provisions &c. &c. the property of the currency
of Texas - to wit the Mexican Government - and det-
ained for the Mexican Army - that the said
Cargo was contraband of war - that the Master
of said Schonner Capt. M. M. Munn has exhibited no
manifest - bill of lading or any other memoran-
dum of the contents of said Cargo - that the
said Schonner being engaged in the transportation
contrary to the laws of nations and to the great injury of Texas
of contraband of war has forfeited her neutral-
ity - and ought to be condemned as also her car-
go for the benefit of the government of Texas and
her captors - wherefore I pray that the forego-
ing facts be enquired into - and that by the
Judgement of your Honourable court - the
said Schonner and Cargo may be condemned
and ordered to be sold or otherwise disposed
of according to law as may seem best for
the benefit of the Government of Texas
and the Captors - and as in duty bound
